This month we hear from Deborah Dick who lives in northern Idaho, up in the mountains above a small town with the tiniest LNS ever, and who's comment 'Thank

goodness for the Internet and groups like The Sampler Life for inspiration' would be understood by many of our members who live in remote areas ...

We'll let Deborah tell the story from here. The first experience I had with stitching was a piece of needlepoint, for a coffee coaster. It was a rather ornate Celtic cross, a rather ambitious project for a girl of my age, I suppose, but it whetted my appetite. I was about 12 then and was in a church group whose leader must have been a stitcher. This was way back when girls of that age had no electronics to play with and TV had so few programs it was hardly worth turning the knob.

So reading and stitching became my favorite activities, and of course making pot holders on my little metal loom, and yards of that spool lace done with Knitting Nancy. Essentially, threads and fibers of any kind and all those wonderful colors - far more than in my box of Crayolas - and what they could be made to represent, fascinated me.

Then in 1978, when I was just 30 I met a crotchety old woman (she was at least 50) and the real love affair began.

The fascinating woman lived in a

weathered, 3 storey Victorian house on the corner of a busy street, hidden by an enormous hedge. The town and traffic were hectic - noise, dust, not so appealing. But when I walked through her front door, I entered a world of samplers.

Her walls, crowing with 12 foot ceilings, were covered, literally, with samplers of every kind. All old looking and some really were old, because as I said, she was ancient - 50, you know.

She shared her knowledge, some fabric, took me to several of her favorite shops and we began. She even taught me how to buy old frames at the flea market and cut to size to add to the charm of the sampler reproductions that I adored.

Like Alice Down the Rabbit Hole I began my enchanted journey ...

So just like Alice Down the Rabbit Hole, I began my enchanted journey, from Merrily Beams to Darlene O'Steen to all the hundreds of other wonderful designers.

And on into the world of special stitches, linens, and even dying my own fabric. I came to appreciate many styles but my favorite remains the old fashioned sampler.

Now I have begun to dabble seriously with designs of my own and hope one day someone will stumble through the front door of this old lady's house - for I am now far past 50, you know - and discover that magic world of painting with needle and thread.

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A STITCHER'S CHRISTMAS TOY BOX

New From The Cat's Whiskers Design Studio

This design will be released end September, 2009 at the TNNA Fall Needlecraft Market.

A glorious fabric box filled to the brim with little stitching accessories that double as Christmas decorations. There's a Christmas cracker stitching roll, a present scissor fob, a 3" rule pocket, a triangular threadkeep holder and a wee little tin topper for pins and needles.

Christmas in Australia is bright and sunny and full of flowers - and the colours in this new design reflect that wonderful tropical feeling of Christmas in the Southern Hemisphere.



Originally a teaching piece, the charts, stitching instructions and finishing notes for this project are extremely clear and comprehensive. This design comes as a 20 page booklet.

Stitched on 32 count Belfast Gold/Raw using Dinky-Dyes Silks and Silk Ribbons Floss and ribbon packs for this project are also available.

This design will also be released end September, 2009 at the TNNA Fall Needlecraft Market.

A lovely little 'natural on raw' French-inspired Christmas ornament which will only take a couple of evenings to stitch and construct.

The pack includes the stitching chart, comprehensive finishing instructions and a skein of Dinky-Dyes 'natural' silk floss. A wonderful 'starter' project for young stitchers, and an easy project for experienced stitchers looking for a pretty little Christmas gift for a friend.

The embroidery and craft show season really starts in earnest at the end of August with Festival of Quilts at the NEC in Birmingham 20th - 23rd August (www.twistedthread.com) followed in October by The Knitting and Stitching shows in Alexandra Palace, London (8th - 11th Oct) and Dublin (29th Oct - 1st Nov) with Harrogate later in November (19th - 22nd).

The Stitch and Creative Craft shows are held in Manchester (4th - 6th Sept), Esher in Surrey (18th - 20th September) and Belfast (12th - 14th November). (www.sccshows.co.uk).

Crafts for Christmas combined with Hobby Crafts will be at SECC Glasgow (22nd - 25th Oct) and at NEC Birmingham (5 - 8th Nov) (www.ichf.co.uk/indoorcraftsalive)

I wish I had the time, and the money, to go to them all! In November I will probably go to The Knitting and Stitch Show in Harrogate.

My favourite show, The Fashion and Embroidery Show is no longer in

Harrogate this year and has moved to NEC Birmingham for it's 21st Anniversary (25th - 26th February 2010) (www.ichf.co.uk/fashion) Please oh please come back to Harrogate!
